Key themes of feedback received from Members following the paper circulated in May, during or after events regarding the financial pressures that Events are facing

• Increasing income

- Events are a major part of Guild membership and reserves should be used to cover any losses if required. Add more layouts to one day shows to attract more people
- Increase marketing and sales pitches to get more non-members to attend
- Show case all aspects of O gauge and all eras to get more people to attend
- Ticket prices need to increase where else can you have a day out for £5.00
- Do not subsidise members entry not all members benefit from the price reduction because not all members attend
- Increase subscriptions and use part of the subs to contribute to event provision
- O Why not take £1.00 from each member for events?
- Ask traders to sponsor aspects of the show or sponsor layout attendance
- Please do not increase B & B commission again?
- Using membership donations for large layouts
- Having Club modular layout contributions

Suggestions to reduce expenditure

- o Change venues as required
- Reduce the amount of meals, expenses and travel claimed by Guild personnel
- Layouts and demonstrators do not get evening meals why do Guild officers? There is a two-tier system

- Accommodation should only be in twin rooms for all unless there are health needs – layouts do not get single rooms
- You do not need to supply hot meals at lunchtime have sandwiches
- Seek alternate suppliers for additional furniture hire / equipment
- Find a different way of doing logistics to reduce van hire and extra hotel costs
- Use local stewards and reduce the number of Guild team members who attend including Event Team Members
- Other committees should pay for their own attendance. Guild sales are self-funding like a mini business. So, should the other committees be
- We have to pay for food at home, why do we expect the Guild to pay for evening meals
- Charge Societies and Guild Committee for their tables / floor space / power like traders but at a reduced price.
- o Reduce the size of shows
- Stop holding one day shows and just publicise the O gauge group shows across the country and support them with a donation each year
- Have joint shows with ALSRM / G1MRA / EMGS / Scale Forum etc
- Do not stop our face to Face Shows

- Given rising costs, I will need to cut my stand size to one table instead of two.
 On line sales are good
- I still want to do shows even though on-line sales are good but van hire, fuel and hotel prices are going up so it has to be worth my while attending
- Give new traders free or discounted space
- Consider a charge for societies

- Please do not stop the discount scheme I will not be able to come or will just do one show
- We are facing all of the same issues the Guild is facing. I am going to have to seriously look at all the shows I do and decide which ones I have to drop. The Guild stand rates are on a par with the others but the discount scheme keeps me coming
- Please do not make the traders pick up the deficits by charging us lots more.
