## The layouts

#### L1 East Midlands Test Track

Nelson Keen and the East Midlands O Gauge Group

Come and exercise your locos, or your purchases, on the test track, which caters for most wheel standards (except S7 or coarse scale), employing 12v or 24v either DC or DCC. Clearances between the lines also permit 16mm running on 32mm track. The test track is in the Sports Hall and the live steamers will also be using this track.

#### L2 Weekend Yard O Gauge

Owned by the Gauge O Guild

Kevin and Judy Carwright look after this layout and it tours the UK showing what is possible to achieve with everything being 'off the shelf'. The layout was built during the weekend of Guildex 2023 and every item used in the project, except the backscene is available from retailers including stock, the track, wiring, scenic materials and buildings. The back scene artwork is by the talented Paul Bambrick.



L3 East Road O Gauge

East Road is a fictional 7mm/O Gauge model railway layout, depicting a diesel maintenance depot with a re-fuelling facility. It is loosely based in the Scottish region during the BR Blue TOPS era, between 1974 and 1987. East Road, started life in EM Gauge. When the ready to run 7mm Class 26 and Class 27 locomotives were released in late 2023 and early 2024, as well as the Inverness styled Class 26, that swayed the decision to upscale to 7mm.



#### L4 Haymarket O Gauge

After building two Railway Laser Lines shed fronts, I could not resist putting something together as a backdrop for taking pictures of my fleet. A diorama based on Haymarket depot in the early 90s was born, last knockings of the BRCW class 26s and, plenty of Scottish based

#### L8 Oil Drum Lane O Gauge

Oil Drum Lane is a minimal space layout that started life as a pair of test tracks on a recycled base board from a historic decommissioned OO gauge layout; used to run and test my growing collection of O gauge locos.

With ongoing house renovations to allow at Guildex but now extended, the layout shows a larger layout, I extended my test track to practice working in 7mm scale, and so 'Oil Drum Lane' was born. It depicts a small corner of a large yard somewhere in Manchester, to support the fuelling of diesel shunters and the occasional larger mainline freight loco, with some steam locos operating on the periphery of the fuelling point.

#### L9 Chipped Lane O Gauge

This O gauge layout represents a fictitious LMS branch line terminus in the North-west of England, amongst the Pennine foothills; the local passenger and freight trains have long since passed into history. Originally the terminus of a mineral line in the 1830s, the site was used for the construction of a new branch line in the 1860s on a lower level: the high-level lines are all that is left of the old railway. Traffic on this line is not frequent but essential to maintain the local community, mills and quarries, before the advent of road transport.




L10 Willowbrook Marsh

Willowbrook Marsh is a small goods depot and maltings complex, situated on the borders of the Midland and Eastern regions of British Railways, north of Peterborough during the late 1950-60s. The location is typical of the Fenland scenery with plenty of space and traditional looking buildings for the area. Traffic consists of goods workings plus special consists for the local maltings, which operates its own shunting locomotive when a BR diesel shunter is unavailable. Small diesel shunting locomotives are very much in evidence handling the majority of loose fitted wagon traffic. Being a relatively quiet backwater, often having long periods of time between arrivals and departures, there is time for much shunting


