



Forms which can be completed via an entry point at the bottom of each Show Page. 117 received by Wednesday 4 November at 13:00.


Q1.

On a scale of 1 – 5 how did you like the show? (1 = Did not like. 5 = Like a lot)




Q2.

- Some videos were too basic

Wider range of layouts (8)

- More at home but differing standards not just exhibition standard (2)
- More international
- More narrow gauge
- More coarse scale
- Greater mix of eras – many were late steam

- Some layout videos too long – just running without a story board
- Some videos too short

Comments about traders (5)

- More traders should take the opportunity to discuss new / recently released products
- Miss browsing the traders stands and handling products
- Miss having a 1:1 with the trader

General ideas about content mix (4)

- Have a chat room
- Forget Zoom and Facebook – use YouTube for presentation format
- Keep Zoom and You Tube – ditch Skype and Facebook

Positives / easy navigation / cannot be better (27)

- Having only one glitch was really good (Monksbury on FB)
- Return to Main Hall Button was invaluable

Improvements (18)

- Make the entry obvious – did not realise you had to double click on Doors Open picture
- Make feedback form easier to access

- Use one broadcast route not four (Skype / Zoom / You Tube / FB)
- Gave up on Zoom – too fiddly and did not like seeing myself on computer screen
- Zoom issues – stuck on 'download and run'

Positives

“Seeing familiar faces, seeing people for the first time, seeing that there is quite a lot of modern images despite the Guild Talk sceptics, looking at trade sites I wouldn't normally seek out, watching techniques I admire but don't have the skill to copy, seeing new techniques eg 3D in practice.”

While I have not been an 'operator' I have seen some of the difficulties of getting many people with different equipment and skill levels all together. Overall I think the structure worked very well and everyone who worked so hard to make it a success should be commended. I suppose the one suggestion I would have for the next virtual show would be to consider to have a "virtual bar" area. I think one of the things missing was the odd little chat area where you could organise a quick meet with a couple of people or you just bump into people and have a chat for 5-10 minutes. I'm not sure how you can work it in a virtual show but something maybe to consider for the next one”.

“I have MS, getting out and about is difficult. This was wonderful for me as I look around and enjoy the show WITHOUT LEAVING MY ROOM. Thank you very much to everyone involved in setting up this marvellous visual show”.

“There were things shown that would not be possible at a 'physical' show, so I think that's brilliant. I particularly enjoyed the machining and demonstration videos. Well done Jackie and team!

Interestingly I would not normally spend that much time looking at videos on the internet, but because it was packaged as an event it was somehow more compelling and I was watching stuff most of the day.”

Suggestions for Improvement

"You will be under pressure to do more shows. Don't be tempted to do the same again because it worked. Interest will soon wane. Inevitably, there won't be the same excitement the second time around. Focus on the things that worked well and develop them. Chuck out the stuff that didn't, even if that makes the show smaller. Make sure people realise a future show isn't just a repeat".

"Maybe some of the video demonstrators might give a little more thought to their camera placements etc.? Our American cousins do this very well on their You Tube videos . . ."

"Some layouts had background music which was too loud / distracting / needed a story board so you knew what was running"

"The competition should be restricted to "all my own work" entries."

"The traders area - more use of demo videos please. I'd suggest GOG host a demo stand for smaller traders' products."

"More live content would be great if possible."

"The sound. The sound varied so much probably due to the equipment used but if the quality could be increased that would be great for those of us afflicted with bad ears".

"Some videos were very long (and so high data use on my mobile) and others very short. Could there be a better balance, perhaps with a choice of 5-15 min highlights and a full layout video?"

"Bring the members wants and sales section of the Guilds website more into the "hall", I'm missing the bring and buy of shows"

"Enlisting more people to publicise it, to increase participation by non-members - especially 4mm modellers thinking of moving up a scale."

"Perhaps have an entry button on web page of the Guild Website"

"Remembering your audience who might not be the most social media savvy I would stay within the same broadcaster rather than flicking between Facebook, zoom, and utube".

"From the feedback the Show was a resounding success. And members want another in Spring 2021. But I just wonder how costs stack up ie A normal Show with expensive Hall and other costs but with admission and traders fees, compared with a virtual one with IT costs and all the voluntary work put in. ie Will we be quids in with this Covid approach?"

"My only comment was it was not clear from the advance notices how to get into the exhibition considering you indicated that certain sessions were by Skype, ZOOM or another tool which had me wondering what tool do I have to use to see the various parts of the show? Somebody told me that everything was accessed via the Guild website. Maybe the access process could have been clearer".

“Would be great if you can keep the modelling techniques videos somewhere else on the website after the show has finished - they could be really useful for future reference”

“Maybe more demonstrations - e.g. laying track, buildings, scenery”
